

WORK SAFELY; FOLLOW THE LIFE SAVING RULES



1

While you are carrying out work, a railAlert Safety Inspector (RSI) might determine that you are in violation of one of the Life Saving Rules (LSR).

In this case, the RSI will always request the reason for this violation of the LSR and make a record of this. You and your employer will both receive a confirmation of this. You will both be given the opportunity to further contextualise and justify this violation.

The violation and the justification will be presented to the railAlert Evaluation Committee (EC). The EC is comprised of safety experts from the railway sector. They will determine whether a violation had indeed been committed.

This evaluation will take place on an anonymous basis. The EC will not be aware of any previous transgressions.

Once it has been determined that you have committed a violation, your employer and ProRail will be notified of this. In determining a sanction, they will take any previous transgressions on your part into consideration as well.

Your employer will adhere to your company's guidelines in enforcing a sanction or deciding not to do so.

ProRail has the right to temporarily or permanently deny you access to the railways and to the ProRail construction sites. It will only do so in case of multiple transgressions or reckless behaviour.

Analysing the violations and the reasons for these violations helps to make the railway sector safer.
